**ORDER OF SUSPENSION**

**GEORGE ANYAJI,  
Respondent.**

Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(A) requires the Administrative Director of the Division of Workers' Compensation (Administrative Director) to suspend any physician, practitioner, or provider from participating in the California workers' compensation system as a physician, practitioner, or provider if the individual or entity has been convicted of any felony or misdemeanor and that crime either: (1) involves fraud or abuse of the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs, the Medi-Cal program, or the workers' compensation system, or fraud or abuse of any patient; (2) relates to the conduct of the individual's medical practice as it pertains to patient care; or (3) is a financial crime that relates to the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs, the Medi-Cal program, or the workers' compensation system.

Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(B) requires the Administrative Director to suspend any physician, practitioner, or provider from participating in the California workers' compensation system as a physician, practitioner, or provider if the individual or entity has been suspended, due to fraud or abuse, from the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs or the Medi-Cal program.

Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(C) requires the Administrative Director to suspend any physician, practitioner, or provider from participating in the California workers' compensation system as a physician, practitioner, or provider whose license, certification or approval to provide health care services has been surrendered or revoked.

1 On or about November 10, 2015, Respondent George Anyaji (Anyaji) was  
2 convicted in the Superior Court of California, County of San Diego, of crimes described  
3 in Labor Code section 139.21(a)(1)(A). (People v. George Anyaji, Case No. CD262202.)

4 On or about June 4, 2014, Respondent Anyaji was suspended, due to fraud or  
5 abuse, from the federal Medicare or Medicaid programs.

6 On or about May 26, 2017, Respondent Anyaji's license, certification or approval  
7 to provide health care services was surrendered or revoked by the Medical Board of  
8 California, Department of Consumer Affairs.

9 On or about July 26, 2022, the Administrative Director mailed to Respondent  
10 Anyaji a written notice of the right to a hearing regarding the suspension and the  
11 procedure to follow to request a hearing, as provided in Labor Code section  
12 139.21(b)(2) and California Code of Regulations, title 8, section 9788.1.

13 Pursuant to Labor Code section 139.21(b)(2) and California Code of Regulations,  
14 title 8, section 9788.1(d), the written notice advised Respondent Anyaji that the  
15 suspension would start thirty (30) calendar days after the date of mailing of written  
16 notice, unless Respondent Anyaji submitted a written request for a hearing within ten  
17 (10) calendar days of the date of mailing of the notice.

18 Respondent Anyaji did not submit a written request for hearing within ten (10)  
19 calendar days of the date of mailing of the notice.

20 The Administrative Director is required to suspend any physician, practitioner, or  
21 provider pursuant to Labor Code section 139.21 and California Code of Regulations,  
22 title 8, section 9788.2, after thirty (30) days from the date the notice was mailed, unless  
23 the physician, practitioner, or provider submits a written request for a hearing within ten  
24 (10) calendar days of the date of mailing of the notice;

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1           **IT IS HEREBY ORDERED** that Respondent George Anyaji is hereby suspended  
2 from participating in the California workers' compensation system as a physician,  
3 practitioner, or provider.
