### HOLIDAYS

Pursuant to Labor Code Section 1773 the Holidays for this craft are based upon  
Government Code Section 6700

6700. (a) The holidays in this state are:

(1) Every Sunday, (2) January 1<sup>st</sup>, (3) The third Monday in January, known as "Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Day", (4) February 12<sup>th</sup>, known as "Lincoln Day", (5) The third Monday in February, (6) March 31<sup>st</sup>, known as "Cesar Chavez Day", (7) The last Monday in May, (8) July 4<sup>th</sup>, (9) The first Monday in September, (10) September 9<sup>th</sup>, known as "Admission Day", (11) The fourth Friday in September, known as "Native American Day", (12) The second Monday in October, known as "Columbus Day", (13) November 11<sup>th</sup>, known as "Veterans Day", (14) December 25<sup>th</sup>, (15) Good Friday from 12 noon until 3 p.m.

(16) (A) Every day appointed by the President or Governor for a public fast, thanksgiving, or holiday; (B) Except for the Thursday in November appointed as Thanksgiving Day, this paragraph and paragraphs (3) and (6) shall not apply to a city, county, or district unless made applicable by charter, or by ordinance or resolution of the governing body thereof.

(b) If the provisions of this section are in conflict with the provisions of a memorandum of understanding reached pursuant to Chapter 12 (commencing with Section 3560) of Division 4 of Title 1, the memorandum of understanding shall be controlling without further legislative action, except that if those provisions of a memorandum of understanding require the expenditure of funds, the provisions shall not become effective unless approved by the Legislature in the annual Budget Act.
