

Recruiting Cal/OSHA Elevator Safety Engineers



The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) is hiring Associate Safety Engineers (ASE, Elevators) and Senior Safety Engineers (SSE, Elevators) throughout the state:

Associate Safety Engineer, Elevators	\$7,482 - \$9,360
Senior Safety Engineer, Elevators	\$8,810-\$11,026

ASEs are field positions that conduct new, altered, and periodic inspections of conveyances in many different settings and consult with employers on a wide range of conveyance safety issues. They write requirements enforcing the Elevator Safety Orders (Title 8) to protect the riding public and workers in the elevator industry. SSEs supervise ASEs and perform administrative and leadership duties such as rulemaking, code committee participation, IT design and support, training, variance evaluations, controller acceptance, and device approvals. You will be notified of the status of your admittance into the exam at least 10 days before the exam date and provided instructions on taking the exam. You must take and pass the exam before applying for a job with Cal/OSHA. If you pass the exam, you will be placed on an eligibility list and provided instructions on how to apply for a particular job.
