> final personnel note, Patty noted that the Board will need to hire a fifth retired annuitant or an intermittent position to fill in for a member of the Board's staff who was recently injured in a major car accident and will be out for an extended period.

In regards to Zoom conferences and hearings: Patty reported that a new Zoom contract is in the works.
