Chair Carter thanked members of the Appeals Board staff for their analysis of AB 1277, which was submitted to the DIR.

Member Freyman also reported on her meeting with the staff members, where they several topics, including 342(a) and penalties for late reporting.

ACTION: Acting Executive Officer Kari Johnson has been working on the ORACLE migration project. Members of the DIR IT staff are here today to help the staff with testing and to discuss further improvements. Judge Neil Robinson has also been working on the project because he has past experience.

Acting EO Johnson also explained that the Board is making the switch from Westlaw to Lexis Nexis, with staff training to be held next week. Lexis Nexis contains all of the Board's decisions, so it may no longer be

necessary to keep hard copies of the originals longer than the state-required records retention period.
