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# **Introduction to Contracts - Overview**

- Contracts are used to procure services for the State
- The rules and processes regarding State contracting are described in Public Contract Code, Government Code, and others
- State Contracting Manual (SCM)
- Delegated Authority from the Department of General Services (DGS) for Non-It Services, such as: <u>Public Contract Code (PCC) § 10295</u>; <u>PCC § 10335 et seq.</u>
- Rules are designed to protect the State, promote fairness and competition, and ensure public funds are spent appropriately



#### **Contracting Process - Competitive Bidding Methods**

- Public advertisement of bidding opportunities (\$10K or more)
- Posted on <u>CaleProcure</u> min. 10 business days. Common timeframe for RFPs is 25-30
- Strict requirements for evaluation teams
- Protest (PCC §§ 10341 10345 and Title 2 CA Code of Regulations §§ 1195 - 1195.6)
- Award can be 4-8 months or more depending on the method, complexity, number of bidders, etc.



### **Request for Proposals (RFPs)**

- Program Develops justification, Scope of Work and Budget
- Contract Branch finalizes and posts RFP
- Contract Branch conducts an administrative review
- Programs Panel members review and score proposal
- Award is determined and a Public Notice is Posted
- Contract Branch prepares contract and obtains signatures
- Programs Contract Manager notifies contractor to start work



#### **Contracting Process - Competitive Bidding Methods – RFP (Primary vs. Secondary)**

- Primary RFP Award is to the responsible proposer offering the lowest cost for its services.
- Secondary RFP Award is to the responsible proposer earning the highest overall score.



## **Request for Information (RFIs)**

- Obtain input about market, availability, other details
- Contract is not awarded via the RFI
- Information obtained from the RFI may be used to develop and finalize the RFP



### **Competitively Bid Contracts-Limitations**

- Contract limitations if an amendment is needed
- Limitations on processing timeframe
- Services are limited to what's listed in the Scope of Work and Cost Sheet



# **Key Takeaways**

- Fair and transparent competitive process
- Only specific persons are authorized to be part of the review and scoring panel
- Options to issue a RFI may be considered to obtain information
- There are limitations to competitively bid contracts
