

Recruiting Cal/OSHA Elevator Safety Engineers



The California Division of Occupational Safety and Health (Cal/OSHA) is hiring Associate Safety Engineers (ASE, Elevators) and Senior Safety Engineers (SSE, Elevators) throughout the state:

CLASSIFICATION	MONTHLY SALARY RANGE
Associate Safety Engineer, Elevators	\$8,294–\$10,376, plus differential*
Senior Safety Engineer, Elevators	\$9,766–\$12,223, plus differential*

* Assistant, and Associate Safety Engineers receive geographic pay differential of \$250 per month if their worksite is located in Alameda, Marin, San Mateo, San Francisco, or Santa Clara counties. All employees in engineering classifications with 20 years or more of state service receive a longevity pay differential of +2% or more of their base salary.

ASEs are field positions that conduct new, altered, and periodic inspections of conveyances in many different settings and consult with employers on a wide range of conveyance safety issues. They write requirements enforcing the Elevator Safety Orders to protect the riding public and workers in the elevator industry. SSEs supervise ASEs and perform administrative and leadership duties such as rulemaking, code committee participation, IT design and support, training, variance evaluations, controller acceptance, and device approvals. 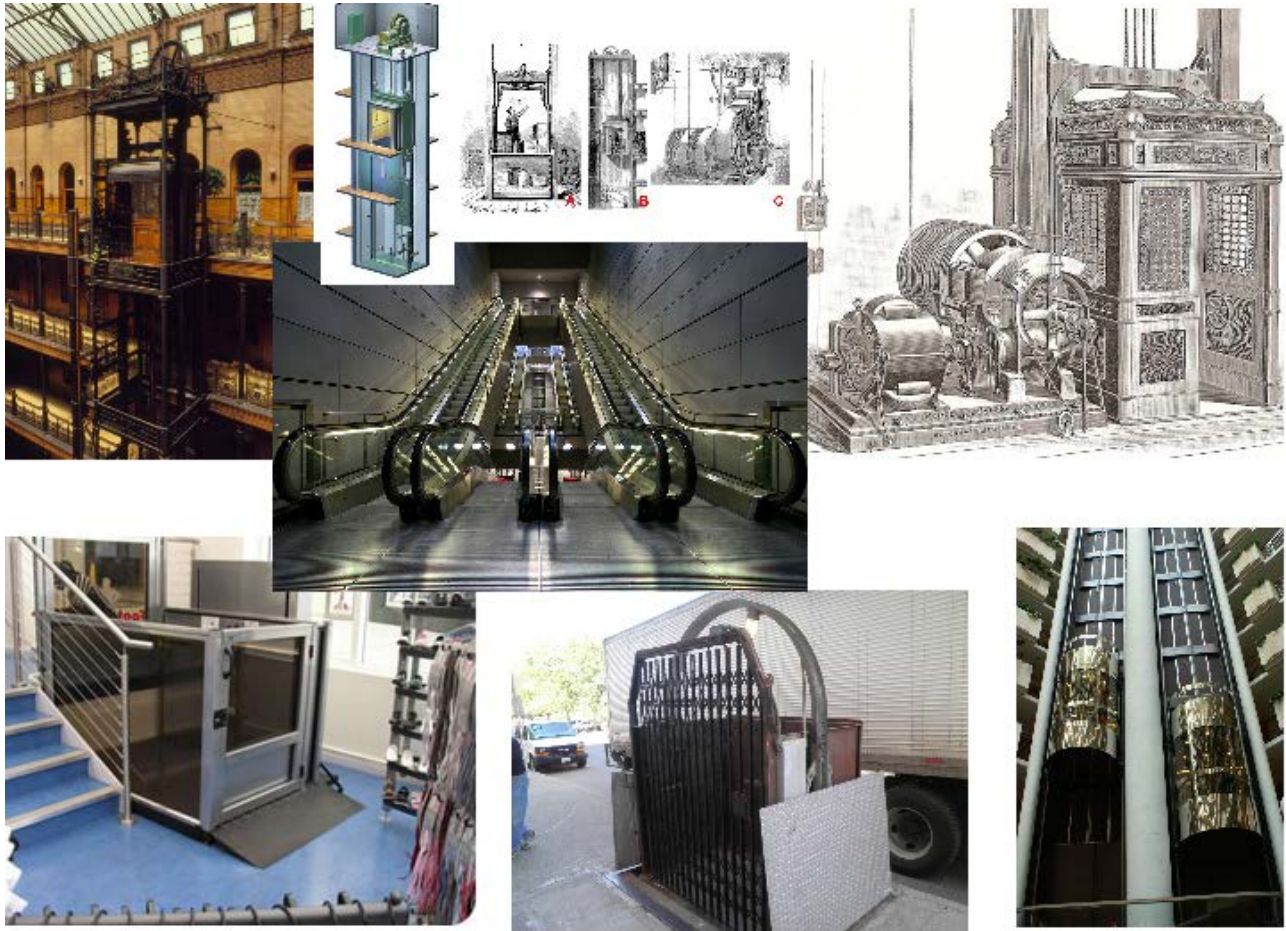
Examinations are being offered periodically for ASE (Elevators) and SSE (Elevators). Candidates must meet the minimum qualifications, possess strong analytical and communication skills, and be able to prioritize tasks and meet multiple demands and deadlines. When available, the exam bulletins are posted online. - To apply for an exam, click on the exam bulletin link for the particular job title that interests you and click on the particular exam ID. Then click on “ACCESS AN OFFICIAL COPY OF THE BULLETIN ON THE DEPARTMENT OF INDUSTRIAL RELATIONS’ WEBSITE.” Follow the instructions to complete and file the exam application. You will be notified of your admittance status at least 10 days before the exam date and provided with instructions on taking the exam. You must take and pass the exam before applying for a job with Cal/OSHA. If you pass the exam, you will be placed on an eligibility list.
- To apply for a job, click on the job vacancy link for the particular job title that interests you. This will take you to a page that requires you to either create a CalCareer account or login if you already have an account. Then follow the instructions to complete and submit your job application.
